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FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR, MR. BRIAN KUIPER

We have received comments and phone calls from numerous neighbors who are excited about what is happening at Heritage.

We will never be able to personally thank each person who put their hands to this work. However, a "thank you" is deserved by many. To the man who oversaw the improvements and coordinated them, to the building and technology committee members who have labored tirelessly, to the playground installers, to the retirees who have spent hours, to the painting crews, to the ladies who cleaned, to the movers and adopt-a-roomers, to the staff members who have helped beyond simply moving their items – THANK YOU! I add a personal thank you to Joel Engelsma, Josh Hoekstra, Erika Aalsma, Sharon Kraker, and Mike Noorman – the transition team who helped set the building up to function well, and planned and orchestrated an efficient move.

When this article gets to your hands, there will be 2 weeks until school begins. The answer to your questions is YES! We will be ready. God has strengthened the work of our hands, and the evidence is seen. Thanks be to Him!

What follows is informative in nature and attempts alphabetically to answer many questions that are posed:

 Busing: Our buses will run according to the routes listed in this edition of the *Heralder*. The Hudsonville Public routes are drawn up by them and normally communicated by postcard LATE August. Transfers will again occur at the High School if students are coming in from the southern side of the district, and will occur at Hudsonville Christian ELEMENTARY for those coming from the northern part of the district. This is a change due to our move, and there will be staff at both locations to help our students who need transfer help.

- Cornerstone: The cornerstone from 4900 40th was removed and will be (or has been) installed at the new campus.
- 3) Driving: For those of you driving to school or attending school for events, please recognize that we are in the middle of a residential neighborhood. There is a 3 way stop at the intersection of Winter Drive and Autumn Drive if you are coming in from the West. There is a NO LEFT TURN from the school driveway if you are exiting to the North to San Ru Avenue. This is designed to keep traffic from HCS from driving though the Oak Tree Apartment complex. We have asked them to not use our property as a drive through, so let's reciprocate.
- Neighbors: Again, we want to be good neighbor, so let's be sure that we do not allow trash or event parking to dim our neighbor's view of us as a community.
- 5) Panthers: We remain the Heritage Christian School Panthers. Our identity has not changed because the address has changed. The biggest transgression of this will be in the junior high gymnasium, where the floor will say "Freedom Christian School" and "Falcons" until such a time as we need to completely redo it. The floor was re-lettered and re-striped only 2 years ago, so it is in very good shape – and considerable expense would be incurred to make these changes.
- 6) **Parking**: Staff and supporter parking on school days will be primarily in the North parking lot. This is where the main offices and entrances are, so please find a parking spot in the lot, and come in through the north

doors to transact any business that you have at the school.

- 7) Playground: Our new playground is installed, and fun to play on. However, the grass will be tender when school begins. Staff will likely be letting students in prior to the start of the school day, and directing them to designated footpaths to access the play areas.
- 8) Security: It is a fact that security is of utmost importance to staff, Board, and parents. The campus will be a locked campus, with procedures and instructions in place for all students and supporters to get in as needed. Publishing all of these in a public document is unwise, but we are happy to answer any questions that you have by phone or email.
- 9) Staff: Shortly, it will be my pleasure to welcome all staff back to the building for a regular schedule. I am looking forward to the opportunities that we will have this year to work together for the good of the King and for His kingdom citizens. A special welcome to Miss Emily Gritters (1st grade), Mrs. Rhonda Holstege (2nd grade), Mr. Todd Timmerman manager), and (facility Mrs. Katie Baatenburg, Mrs. Lisa VandenTop, and Miss Emily Monsma who will be working alongside HCS staff in the Special Education program!

It is my prayer that as the work goes "fast on", we and others will see and experience that the Lord blesses the work of our hands and prospers it for His glory.

ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE REPORT ~ MR. KURT VANOVERLOOP

The Enrollment Committee met this past June with each of the new families that will be sending their children to Heritage for the first time. During these meetings with each family we go over our mission statement, our basis of beliefs and we have the opportunity to explain how the school operates on a daily basis. The meeting also allows us to answer questions from the parents who might be a little anxious sending their child off to school for the first time. This year's Enrollment Committee interviewed and welcomed, with the School Board's approval, 17 new families. The make-up of these 17 families is: 7 boys and 11 girls, with 14 of them entering kindergarten one entering 1st and 6th, and 2 entering 4th grade.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT ~ MR. ERIC DYKSTRA

We are grateful to our heavenly Father for the gift of Heritage Christian School and the continued means to financially support the school. The financial sacrifice that is made by the families that support HCS is not unnoticed and the Finance Committee along with the rest of the Board would like to thank all these families.

The 2014-2015 school year was quite a year; we started it owning our school on 40th Ave and leasing the Beaverdam School with an option to buy. We have since sold our school on 40th Ave, are no longer in a lease with the Beaverdam School, and have bought the former Freedom Christian School and are moved in. As a board we are grateful for this and for the support we received from everyone. The Board is also glad to be down to one property, as having three locations last year had many challenges as well for students, parents, and staff.

The 2014-2015 school year ended with expenses exceeding budgeted expenses by \$32,000. The Board had projected a \$70,000 shortfall due to adding expenses for the new campus. The expenses for maintaining the three locations stayed below what was budgeted, and we ended up overall to the positive. We are looking forward to what the new improvements made will do for both the electric and gas expenses for this coming school year.

In April, the Society approved a budget for the new location. The budgeted expense for the upcoming school year campus is \$2,311,057 with tuition accounting for just over \$1,855,00.00 of these expenses. The remaining funds must come from drives, church collections, fundraisers, Foundation, and other gifts. The new budget has a Fall drive of \$145,000, and a Spring drive of \$145,000.

The Finance committee would like to especially thank those who do not have children at HCS, but who willingly give at the time of the drives and to the collections. Without the success of these drives and collections, the tuition for each family would be much higher. We ask for your continued support for the coming school year and that you continue to give as God has blessed you.

We are about to begin this 2015-2016 school year with a new direction and challenges ahead in moving into the new school. It is our prayer as the Finance Committee that God will continue to bless us and guide us as we tend to the instruction of our children at Heritage Christian School.

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT ~ MR. TIM VANDYKE

From the Transportation Committee, we can say that even though it is not foremost in our minds, there is always something going on regarding the transportation and the maintaining of our bus fleet. This was especially true this past year with the buying and selling of buses and the added challenge of shuttling between Heritage East and Heritage West (Beaver Dam). Our first thought each school day is that there are approximately 125 stops our buses make in order to transport the busing students to and from their homes. This number does not include the many other vehicles that bring the rest of our children to and from their homes. Many prayers go up to God each day for traveling mercies, and once again God has been faithful to us this past year and has answered our prayers, and for that we give Him our thanks.

Next, we want to thank our transportation supervisor, Mrs. DaVonna Holstege, and the other drivers for the safe, conscientious, and faithful work

they perform each day for us. They start early each morning, especially in the inclement weather, to warm up the buses, do safety checks, and make sure all the lights work before they can begin their routes. Then they have to maneuver their buses down all types of roads and through the storms all to their destinations with 50 energetic children on board. Imagine doing this each day before you go to work! Surprised we have any drivers, right? Well we do, and they faithfully perform their task every day so we extend a big THANK YOU for their labors. This would be a great point to ask that we all talk to our children about obeying the rules for safety reasons, to be at the stops on time, and to ask them how it is going from time to time throughout the year (not only at the beginning of the year). This keeps these things on the minds of the children throughout the year making for an efficient and much more pleasant commute for everyone.

We also report that the state inspectors arrived a little later than normal this year because they had many buses to inspect throughout Upper and Lower

Michigan. Our inspector drove nine hours from the UP to inspect our buses and then had to return to UP the next day because of his busy schedule. But the good news is that all our buses passed inspection, and we have a safe and efficient set of buses to transport our children again this year. We will also be changing the fuel locations of our buses for convenience and some added benefits. Another change for our buses is that we will not have a bus barn to put them in this year. This will be a bit more of a challenge on wintery mornings since the buses will have to be cleaned and defrosted each morning, but we know the drivers will do their best and make them safe. We hope, Lord willing, to have a bus barn again someday soon, but for now we will have to wait. Continue to pray for wisdom and safety, not only for the drivers and children, but also for the board and the teachers as many decisions are made each day on behalf our covenant children, families, and supporters of Heritage Christian School.

BUSING INFORMATION

Those who are planning to ride buses please read the following information: 1) Parents are asked to have their children at the bus stop 5 minutes before their scheduled time. At times students wait in cars at the bus stop. Please make sure your kids are out of the car and ready to board the bus before it stops instead of waiting until the bus is stopped to exit your cars. Time is vital to keeping the bus routes on schedule. 2) The Holland bus students will be picked up in the bus driveway at approximately 3:03 in the afternoon. 3) The first family on each HCS bus route will be notified when the bus will not run, or will be late due to bad weather or a breakdown. It is important that each family then call the next family

BUS RULES ADOPTED BY THE BOARD hey should do if you 5. Anyone destroying bus property

- Instruct your children what they should do if you are not at home when they get dropped off the bus. Tell them about a spare key, a neighbor to go to or the like.
- 2. No eating or drinking on the buses.
- 3. Noise must be kept to a minimum and children must remain seated during the running of the bus.
- 4. If windows are open, nothing may be thrown out, and no part of the body extended out the windows.

HERITAGE CHRISTIAN STUDENT DRESS CODE POLICY

The dress code policy of Heritage Christian School follows. Please review it in order to answer any questions which you may have regarding appropriate dress for school days.

The parents have the primary responsibility for the clothing their children wear to school. We are confident that parents desire to exercise proper judgment in this regard. Because there are occasions when the school and the parents may differ on what is proper and appropriate clothing, Heritage Christian School reserves the right to decide on what is proper and fitting for school wear in accordance with Heritage Christian School policy.

For all the students in grades 6-8, clothing must be modest, and clean. While young children may wear sleeveless blouses or shirts, all students in grades 6-8 will wear blouses or shirts with sleeves. Top garments must be shoulder covering, i.e. no tank tops or straps over the shoulder; bottom garments must be at least mid-thigh length. Bare midriffs and backs, low necklines, and exposed undergarments are not acceptable in any position, i.e. reaching down, stretching, etc. All clothing which is made of sheer material, or which is suggestive, offensive, or advertises alcohol, tobacco, or other "inappropriatefor-school" messages, is prohibited. Hats are not to be worn in school except on specified days; footwear is to be worn at all times during the school day. No forms of sandals may be worn for indoor or outdoor gym classes or for intramurals, due to practical and safety concerns.

Proper, godly behavior is the utmost importance and must always be emphasized to our children.

We must remember that if students misbehave

At any time during the school year, the principal, in consultation with the staff, may prohibit any grooming practice, article of clothing, accessories, emblems and logos, if they are deemed to be a safety concern or a distraction.

Students who choose to violate this policy may be asked to change their clothing or be held out of class. Parents will be notified by the classroom teacher if there is a lack of cooperation on the part of the students.



- Parents who drop off and pick up children: Please read the following notes carefully so that you fully understand the procedures for drivers in the school parking lot. If you are reading this but your spouse drops off the children, PLEASE make sure that they read it or read it to them!! THANKS!


Morning Drop Off Procedure:

- 1. All drop-offs must take place in the WEST parking lot Drive south (to the right as you enter the parking lot) and make a U-turn, pull ahead as far as possible so others can pull up behind you. Have your children promptly exit your vehicle on the passenger side and go directly to the sidewalk. From there they can walk on the sidewalk to their designated door each day. You will then exit the parking lot either through the west drive to Balsam or through the north drive to Port Sheldon.
- If you have business in school, first drop off your students in the WEST parking lot and then park in one of the parking spots in the north parking lot (by the main doors).
- > **DO NOT PARK** in the **WEST** parking lot in the morning.
- **DO NOT ENTER** the bus drive (circular driveway on the north side of school) at any time.



Afternoon Pick Up Procedure:

- For families with students in K-8: Please back into a marked spot on either side of the WEST parking lot. School personnel will help children cross and find rides.
- > If you ONLY have students in 5-8: Please back into a spot on the far east end of the NORTH parking lot.
- Students who are walking to the car in either lot, are instructed to walk ONLY on the sidewalk or a designated area around the parking lot. If they need to cross the parking lot, they may cross when the monitor tells them it is safe to cross.
- > Parents are asked to show by example and only use the crosswalk and the sidewalk.




Please drive very slowly and cautiously and watch for children at all times while on or near school property.

- A Per the Health Department:
 - No open-toed shoes or sandals allowed
 - No tank-tops allowed.
 - Long hair must be tied back.
 - · Kitchen help must wear a baseball cap, or if you prefer, we will provide you with a hairnet.
 - Food from home may not be stored in the restaurant kitchen. If you wish to bring in food for your break, please keep in your vehicle until break time.
- ▲ Dress code and suggestions from the committee:
 - Do not wear your Sunday best. Expect your clothing to get dirty, particularly if you are working in the kitchen. However...
 - Neat, modest, clothing is always appropriate.
 - Shorts are permitted by the Health Department, and suggested by the committee, since it is usually hot in the building.
 - Wear comfortable tennis shoes.
 - Please do not bring large purses or bags with you for your shift. We have limited shelving, so we would appreciate it if you could put your keys and phone in your pockets or in a very small bag.
- Children are not allowed to accompany parents to their shift(s) at the fair, or to the food prep day at school. We could be shut down by the Health Department if this rule is not followed.
- If you are working in the kitchen, expect to wear gloves for most of your shift. We will provide latex-free gloves in two sizes.
- You will be given one 15-30 minute break on your shift, at which time you may order one meal from our kitchen at half price.
- Per the Hudsonville Fair Board, workers in our restaurant are required to pay the regular gate admission fee of \$3.00 per person. We ask that you please consider this your donation to the school. However, if this is a hardship, please contact a committee member during your shift, and we will reimburse you immediately.
- If you are sick or otherwise unable to work your shift, please find a replacement and notify a committee member of this change.
- Remember, we will be representing Heritage **Christian** School to many people this week!
