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FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR, MR. BRIAN KUIPER

"CURA PERSONALIS"

The Latin phrase has the meaning "care of the whole person". It is not my intent in this article to plumb the depths of the historical basis of this phrase, nor to develop its impact on education specifically. However, it has impacted education in many ways including, but not limited to, the beginnings of education for women and girls, the despecialization of academics taught to each student, and the idea that the mind can be developed to appreciate and learn many aspects of academic content. My purpose is to explore what HCS is doing to educate the whole *child*.

Curriculum - what we teach. I am thankful for the work of curriculum directors in our schools, and for the emphasis that Boards are placing on hiring such people. My experience as a teacher was to be handed some textbooks and turned loose to do as much "damage" as I possibly could do! Curricular content is broad and some concepts are more essential than others. Making those decisions while knowing what precedes and follows in the sequence of instruction makes teaching the whole child more possible.

Differentiation - how we teach. There are many ways to teach. Teacher centered teaching tends to be very lecture based. Some subjects (perhaps social studies and Bible) lend themselves better to this type of teaching than others. Other subjects (perhaps math and science) tend to be more student centered in nature due to their hands-on nature or the need for practice to cement learning. Differentiation changes the delivery process, the product that demonstrates learning, sometimes even the level of teaching and instruction based on the needs of each learner. It cannot be individualized to each child (read 22 mini-lessons per class per day...). However, it caters to the fact that there are a variety of students in each classroom. HCS will partner with All Belong (formerly CLC Network) this year - and one of the goals is to have them teach us to be better at differentiating in our classrooms.

Educational Support - how we teach students who struggle to learn like some of the other students. HCS has a strong educational support program as well as the PR Special Education staff that works in our building. This allows us to either put qualified helpers in the room or pull students out of the room when we cannot best meet their educational needs with the general education teachers. These

support staff teachers and aides are trained on the interventions that they are using and can target certain areas of weakness with the goal of returning the student to the regular track of education whenever possible.

Opportunities - what additional opportunities we make available to students. Chess club, robotics, athletics, intramurals, social groups to teach awareness skills, recess buddies, learning challenges or extensions in the classroom provided for those who have learned essential topics and need to be stretched in their learning. We can always do more, but these are some of the opportunities provided by HCS as we work to develop and educate the whole child.

Parents and teachers - who is involved. When parents and teachers stand together in the instruction of His children, each child *will* learn. As we look forward to pulling in the same direction this year, may it be the case that we really do pull in the same direction. Good communication between parents and teachers is needed - sometimes beyond parent-teacher conferences - in order for students to understand that this is a team effort.

The Word - that which ties all of the instruction together. All instruction by any teacher or parent to any child is worthless if it is not instruction that calls the child to see God. "All scripture is given by inspiration of

God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for **instruction** in righteousness" (II Timothy 3:16).

Prayer - seeking His will and blessing is so necessary! Pray daily for the teachers, parents, and students of HCS and faithful schools like ours. Pray that the Lord will bless all teaching and learning with His blessing. This will ensure that each child learns all subjects in the only way that they can be learned - instruction of Him, about Him, and worked in them by Him.

As we begin this new school year, may our desire be to teach each child - and each part of each child - mind, body, heart, and soul, to the glory of His name! Hear the words of the Lord Himself. He speaks to us when we despise knowledge with a command. And, He tells us that there will be fruit upon this education.

"O ye simple, understand wisdom: and, ye fools, be ye of an understanding heart. Hear; for I will speak of excellent things; and the opening of my lips shall be right things. For my mouth shall speak truth; and wickedness is an abomination to my lips. All the words of my mouth are in righteousness; there is nothing froward or perverse in them. They are all plain to him that understandeth, and right to them that find knowledge" (Proverbs 8:5-9).

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT ~ MR. TYLER SCHIMMEL

As we start another school year, we look back on the past year, and we are amazed at the blessings that God has bestowed upon HCS. The finance committee has reviewed the financials from last year, and we are happy to report that we ended the year with a budget surplus! The surplus is primarily due to the generous response of the Fall/Spring drives and our expenses being slightly under budget. The board is currently reviewing the surplus and will be allocating these funds to the future needs of HCS.

This past April, the Society unanimously approved a budget for the 2022-23 school year. The budgeted expenses for the upcoming school year are \$3,099,917 with tuition accounting for \$2,397,417 of these expenses. The remaining funds must come from drives, church collections, fundraisers, the HCS Foundation, and other gifts. The '22-23 budget has a Fall drive of \$195,000 and a Spring drive of \$195,000. Please prayerfully consider the needs of HCS as we begin a new school year in just a few short weeks.

The HCS board would like to thank those who do not have children at HCS, but who willingly give to the drives and to the church collections. Without the success of these drives and collections, the tuition for each family would be much higher. We would also like to thank all of the tuition paying families. The financial sacrifice that is made by the families that support HCS is not unnoticed and the Finance committee along with the rest of the board would like to thank all of these families who make timely tuition payments. We also say thanks to all of those who were a part of boosters, fundraisers, the foundation, and many other committees that help raise funds for the school. We appreciate your time, energy, and enthusiasm for HCS.

The Finance Committee would like to thank our retiring committee members, Steve Bylsma and Tom Holstege. Steve served on the finance committee for 2 years while Tom served as treasurer for 3 years. Thank you men for your service to HCS these past few years! We welcome two new members, Blake Wieringa and Troy Karsemeyer who will be joining Keith Feenstra and myself. Along with the regular duties of the finance

committee, we are currently in the process of updating the HCS website to allow for "online donations". This would allow for secure and direct ACH or credit/debit transactions to be made for Fall/Spring Drives, Memorial Gifts, and to the HCS Foundation. We are hoping to have this up and running before the start of the school year.

Remember to come out and support HCS at the Hudsonville Fair during the week of August 22-27! This is an awesome fundraiser for HCS as we have a full service restaurant along with food booths near the grand stands (that is new this year). Thanks to the fair committee, donors, helpers, and everyone who comes out to support HCS!

TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE REPORT ~ Mr. Scott Ensink

"NOW HIRING!"—We've all seen the signs, at almost every business in the area. It seems that these last couple of years, many companies have struggled to fill their staffing needs and have had to reduce services or open hours per day.

Our churches and schools have had to deal with similar problems. We all know the urgent need our Protestant Reformed churches have for pastors, and we pray continually for the Lord to provide men to take up the work. We've also seen the acute need for teachers in our schools, and we also pray for men and women to fill the gaps. The weekly list that accompanies our church bulletins is not getting shorter.

Also in that list is the need for bus drivers. Heritage Christian School has advertised for several years asking for new drivers with limited response. The need still exists, and I ask those who are reading this article to give serious consideration to taking up the work of transporting our students to and from school each day.

Why drive a bus? There are many positive reasons! Bus drivers contribute to the school body, and help fill an important role. Bus drivers get to know the children that ride their buses, greeting them each day, and building relationships with them that extend beyond the time spent on the bus. Bus drivers have opportunities to drive to and participate in school field trips. Bus drivers also develop driving skills that can be used for more than just school transportation.

Indeed, a few of our drivers have had opportunities to drive coach buses for other school-related events. So, please, consider stepping up and driving a bus. The training is at no expense to new drivers, and the time spent is compensated.

Also, in this issue of the Heralder the list of bus routes is published. We've asked that if your family is able to use Hudsonville Public busing to please do so, and many of you have. Thank you for that. We're also asking many of you who are using Heritage buses to meet the bus at a location other than your homes, in order to keep our route lengths manageable, for both the students and the bus drivers. Thank you in advance for accommodating these requests.

We will be offering limited Monday catechism busing to area churches this year, after a two-year hiatus. We will not be able to accept all requests, but will take as many as space allows. Given the current routes, we will be able to deliver riders to Grandville PRC, Zion PRC, Faith PRC, Trinity PRC, and Holland PRC. Please contact the school office soon to sign up, as seats are limited.

We are thankful for our returning drivers. Not only do they navigate ever-busier traffic and construction zones, but they also keep the buses clean and fueled and perform daily safety inspections. Please encourage your children to be respectful to the drivers and obey their instructions the same as they do for classroom teachers. Once again, please be reminded that the use of electronic devices, including phones and tablets, is not allowed on our buses.

Keeping our fleet of five buses running smoothly would not be possible without the hard work of our Transportation Director Jessica VanderKolk. She works tirelessly to organize bus maintenance and repairs, schedule routes, supervise drivers, and countless other things. The Board is thankful for her

efforts and expertise, and willingness to serve the school.

We look forward to another year of Christian Education at Heritage. Please keep the school and all its activities in your prayers.

BUSING INFORMATION AND ROUTES

Those who are planning to ride Heritage buses, please read the following information:

- Remember that the morning pick up times may be adjusted in the first couple of weeks of school. The corrected times (if there are any) will be published in the school directory.
- Please mark your houses and mailboxes clearly so that our drivers can find your houses easily.
- Parents are asked to have their children at the bus stop 5 minutes before their scheduled time. At times students wait in cars at the bus stop. Please make sure your kids are out of the car and ready to board the bus before it stops instead of waiting until the bus is stopped to exit your cars.

Time is vital to keeping the bus routes on schedule.

 The Zeeland bus (#16) students will be picked up in the bus driveway after the CCHS shuttle is completed, at approximately 3:05 in the afternoon.

The first family on each HCS bus route will be notified when the bus will not run, or will be late due to bad weather or a breakdown. It is important that each family then call the next family on the list. If the next family in line cannot be reached in person, please leave a message, then call the following family on the route so that the calls will continue through to the last person on the list. Don't stop calling until you speak to a live person, please!

BUS RULES ADOPTED BY THE BOARD

- Instruct your children what they should do if you are not at home when they get dropped off the bus. Tell them about a spare key, a neighbor to go to, or the like.
- 2. No eating or drinking on the buses.
- 3. Noise must be kept to a minimum and children must remain seated during the running of the bus.
- 4. If windows are open, nothing may be thrown out, and no part of the body extended out windows.
- 5. Anyone destroying bus property will be responsible for repairs.
- Proper, Godly behavior is the utmost importance and must always be emphasized to our children.
 We must remember that if students misbehave and distract the driver, they endanger everyone on the bus.

HERITAGE CHRISTIAN STUDENT DRESS CODE POLICY

The dress code policy of Heritage Christian School follows. Please review it in order to answer any questions which you may have regarding appropriate dress for school days.

The parents have the primary responsibility for the clothing their children wear to school. We are confident that parents desire to exercise proper judgment in this regard. Because there are occasions when the school and the parents may differ on what is proper and appropriate clothing, Heritage Christian School reserves the right to decide on what is proper and fitting for school wear in accordance with Heritage Christian School policy.

For all the students in grades 6-8, clothing must be modest, and clean. While young children may wear

sleeveless blouses or shirts, all students in grades 6-8 will wear blouses or shirts with sleeves. Top garments must be shoulder covering, i.e. no tank tops or straps over the shoulder; bottom garments must be at least mid-thigh length. Ensure that all pants are modest and rips are not above the knees. Bare midriffs and backs, low necklines, and exposed undergarments are not acceptable in any position, i.e. reaching down, stretching, etc. All clothing which is made of sheer material, or which is suggestive, offensive, or advertises alcohol, tobacco, or other "inappropriate-for-school" messages, is prohibited. Hats are not to be worn in school except on specified days; footwear is to be worn at all times during the school day. No forms of sandals may be worn for indoor or outdoor gym classes or for intramurals, due to practical and safety concerns.

At any time during the school year, the principal, in consultation with the staff, may prohibit any grooming practice, article of clothing, accessories, emblems and logos, if they are deemed to be a safety concern or a distraction.

Students who choose to violate this policy may be asked to change their clothing or be held out of class. Parents will be notified by the classroom teacher if there is a lack of cooperation on the part of the students.


Beginning of the year information:

- Students are not to take I-Pods, MP3 players, or any other listening devices to school. Cell phone use and display by students is also not permitted without permission during school hours.
- Immunization Records are required for all students entering 7th grade, all kindergarteners and all students new to Heritage. Kindergarten health appraisal forms and vision screening certificates are due in the office by the first day of school, August 29. If you sent them in already, thank you! If not, you may drop them off, mail them, or email them to the office. Any questions, please call the office (669-1773). Thanks!
- Thank you: The staff of Heritage Christian School would like to thank all the Board members, Fundraisers, volunteers, bus drivers, and anyone else who has a part in making the school run so smoothly. We look forward to another year of working together!
- Parents who drop off and pick up children for the safety of our children, please follow procedures for morning and afternoon! Read the following notes carefully so that you fully understand the procedures for drivers in the school parking lot. If you are reading this but your spouse drops off the children, PLEASE make sure that they read it or read it to them!! These guidelines apply each and every day of the school year. It appears to be confusing, so if you have questions please ask someone at school! THANKS!

Morning Procedure

- If you have students in K-8, use the WEST parking lot —Drive south, make a U-turn at the far end of the lot, & then pull ahead towards the entrance doors as far as possible and drop off ALL students. (see diagram below).
- **IF you have students ONLY in 5-8, use NORTH** parking lot Enter the 3rd (center) driving lane and pull up to the sidewalk in front of the gym entrance (see diagram below).
- **BOTH LOTS:** Have your children quickly exit your vehicle on the **passenger side** and go directly to the sidewalk. Your children can then walk on the sidewalk to their designated door. You DO NOT have to wait to be first in line to let your children exit your vehicle, but you do need to be by the sidewalk. You will then exit the parking lot either through the west drive to Balsam or through the north drive to Port Sheldon. We are not allowed to exit through the apartment lot to the north of school.
- If you have business in school, first drop off your students and then park in one of the parking spots in the north parking lot (by the main doors).
- **DO NOT PARK** in the **WEST** parking lot before 8:15.
- **DO NOT ENTER** the bus drive at any time.


Morning Procedure diagram:



Afternoon Procedure

- For families with students in K-8: Please back into a marked spot on either side of the WEST parking lot. School personnel will help children cross and find rides.
- If you ONLY have students in 5-8: Please pull into a parking spot on the east side of the NORTH parking lot facing out (see diagram). After 2:30, there will be no driving in the open area between as this will be the walking area. Students will approach cars from the rear and once you have your students, you can exit by using the outside driving lanes. If you arrive later than 2:30, please DO NOT drive in the student walking area. You will need to back into a spot when you can safely do so.
- If you only pick up occasionally, i.e. if there is no public busing, please use the NORTH parking lot. If all spots in the designated area are taken, back into a spot on the far east end, leaving enough room for students to walk behind your car. NO students may walk in the designated driving area.
- Students who are walking to the car in either lot are instructed to walk ONLY on the sidewalk or a designated area in or around the parking lot. If they need to cross the parking lot, they may cross when the monitor tells them it is safe to cross.
- Parents are asked to show by example and only use the crosswalk and the sidewalk.
- If you do not have a handicapped plate, you are not allowed to use the handicapped parking spaces.

From the Health Department

- No tank-tops, open-toed shoes or sandals allowed
- Long hair must be tied back; kitchen help must wear a hat, or we will provide a hairnet
- Food from home may not be stored in the restaurant kitchen. If you wish to bring in food for your break, please keep in your vehicle until break time.

Dress Code and Suggestions from the committee

- Expect your clothing to get dirty, particularly if you are working in the kitchen.
- Neat, modest, clothing is always appropriate. Wear comfortable tennis shoes.
- Shorts are permitted by the Health Department and suggested by the committee, since it is usually hot in the building.
